## Readings & Homily Notes

• This week's Gospel sets up the readings from John 6 where Jesus will 'teach at some length'.

- It follows on from the previous week as the 12 apostles come back and tell Jesus of all they have done and taught.
- This is one of the passages where Jesus' desire to 'rest for a while' is thwarted by the people's desire to follow him.
  - (For many people this will be holiday time when they hope to rest but sometimes circumstances do not allow this to happen.)
- Like the 4th Sunday of Easter this is a 'Good Shepherd Sunday' where the first reading, psalm and gospel each give an image of the shepherd. A shepherd who:
  - brings all back together,
  - looks after and feeds the flock so that it is fruitful and increases
  - who provides rest and guidance
  - who looks with pity and gives of himself
- Though not directly connected with the other texts the second reading the image of Christ as peace who brings all people together provides an echo of the first reading.
- the metaphor linking food and wisdom, (e.g. being fed, being hungry for knowledge) will be explored in the coming weeks. Looking forward it suggests the following:
  - what do we hunger for ?
  - how do we wish to be fed?
