Our Father...



On the day of Pentecost, Peter spoke to the Jews: ‘The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.’

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, ‘What must we do, brothers?’ ‘You must repent,’ Peter answered ‘and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.’ He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, ‘Save yourselves from this perverse generation.’ They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised.

That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

One of fears many Catholics have around the whole Coronavirus crisis is – what happens to Confession – forgiveness? What happens if I or my loved one dies without a last Confession – or the last rites? It is an understandable fear. None of us wants to take the baggage of our life into the next. We want to be prepared. God’s love, though, is not limited to human action. He uses it – but is free to act beyond it. This is what Peter had come to know – the power of God and the work of the Holy Spirit in the world. This is what he wanted to share with the crowds – despite all that had happened, God had not, nor ever would, abandon his people.

God knows that we cannot come to the sacraments as we would usually – but does not, in effect, fold his arms and say, “too bad”. It could be said that God’s love is even stronger for those who are suffering when they do not have recourse to the comfort of the sacraments. Faith will be tested but it could be that our steadfast witness to the love and forgiveness of God will “preach” to the people around us – not, perhaps, as Peter preached but in words and actions of love that show them the love and mercy of God.

- Read the passage slowly – what is the promise that you hear in Peter’s words?
- Which word or phrase seems to resonate most deeply with you – for yourself or someone you know? Jot them down – or repeat them several time to memorise them.
- Sacramental forgiveness – absolution – is a beautiful gift to the Church but each one of us has the capacity to forgive. Reflect today on those who have caused you pain and who might need your forgiveness. You may not be able to let it all go, but, insofar as you can, ask God to forgive what you can. Reflect on the things you need to be forgiven for. Admit them realistically and humbly before God – and sense his love and the Holy Spirit pouring healing into your soul. At a later date, you can bring them into the Sacrament of Reconciliation – but for now, allow it to build your trust in the God who spoke through Peter to people who were complicit in the death of his Son – and offered them his forgiveness.
- Use your word or phrase as a mantra as you go through the morning.



THE GOSPEL OF THE DAY – JOHN 20:11-18

Mary stayed outside near the tomb, weeping. Then, still weeping, she stooped to look inside, and saw two angels in white sitting where the body of Jesus had been, one at the head, the other at the feet. They said, 'Woman, why are you weeping?' 'They have taken my Lord away,' she replied, 'and I don't know where they have put him.' As she said this she turned round and saw Jesus standing there, though she did not recognise him. Jesus said, 'Woman, why are you weeping? Who are you looking for?' Supposing him to be the gardener, she said, 'Sir, if you have taken him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will go and remove him.'

Jesus said, 'Mary!' She knew him then and said to him in Hebrew, 'Rabbuni!' – which means Master. Jesus said to her 'Do not cling to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go and find the brothers, and tell them: I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.' So Mary of Magdala went and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord and that he had said these things to her.



- Spend a few minutes playing this Gospel account in your mind and heart.
Try to imagine yourself by the tomb with Mary – spending time with her in her sorrow:
Bring in those who are also grieving today.
Listen to the conversation between the “Gardener” and Mary and the confusion and misunderstanding that we all feel in times of loss:
Hear the voices of those whose loved ones are in hospital or who have died and who also feel “I don’t know where they have put him/her”.
Hear Jesus speak Mary’s name.
Pray that those who have died may hear that voice call their name. And that those who mourn, hear Jesus speak their name in love and consolation.


Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia!
