Longing for God and His Help in Distress

"Let all who are thirsty come; all who want it may have the water of life." (Rev 22: 17)

FIRST READING OF THE DAY – ISAIAH 42: 1-7

Here is my servant whom I uphold,
my chosen one in whom my soul delights.
I have endowed him with my spirit
that he may bring true justice to the nations.


He does not cry out or shout aloud,
or make his voice heard in the streets.
He does not break the crushed reed,
nor quench the wavering flame.

Faithfully he brings true justice;
he will neither waver, nor be crushed
until true justice is established on earth,
for the islands are awaiting his law.

Thus says God, the Lord,
he who created the heavens and spread them out,
who gave shape to the earth and what comes from it,
who gave breath to its people
and life to the creatures that move in it:

I, the Lord, have called you to serve the cause of right;
I have taken you by the hand and formed you;
I have appointed you as covenant of the people
and light of the nations,

to open the eyes of the blind,
to free captives from prison,
and those who live in darkness from the dungeon.



This is a Reading from the prophet Isaiah that speaks as much to where we are in the current Covid-19 (Corona virus) crisis as it did to the people who first heard these words. During Holy Week, we contemplate the last week of the earthly life of the One whose coming Isaiah foretold – who entered the darkness of the world and set people free from all that held them bound.

- Read the passage slowly – as if hearing the words are being spoken directly to you.
- Which word or phrase seems to resonate most deeply with you – for yourself or someone you know? Jot them down – or repeat them several time to memorise them.
- How can you be someone who offers hope for other people? How can you reach out to people in the dungeon of quarantine or self-isolation? How can you support those for whom it feels like a prison – in which they sit in the darkness of depression or fear?
- Use your word or phrase as a mantra as you go through the morning.

THE GOSPEL OF THE DAY – MATTHEW 21: 1-11



Six days before the Passover, Jesus went to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom he had raised from the dead. They gave a dinner for him there; Martha waited on them and Lazarus was among those

at table. Mary brought in a pound of very costly ointment, pure nard, and with it anointed the feet of Jesus, wiping them with her hair; the house was full of the scent of the ointment. Then Judas

Iscairiot – one of his disciples, the man who was to betray him – said, ‘Why wasn’t this ointment sold for three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor?’ He said this, not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he was in charge of the common fund and used to help himself to the contributions. So Jesus said, ‘Leave her alone; she had to keep this scent for the day of my burial. You have the poor with you always, you will not always have me.’

Meanwhile a large number of Jews heard that he was there and came not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus whom he had raised from the dead. Then the chief priests decided to kill Lazarus as well, since it was on his account that many of the Jews were leaving them and believing in Jesus.

- Spend a few minutes playing this Gospel account in your mind and heart. Notice where you would like to be – an observer – Martha serving – Mary anointing...
- Around the world today, Marthas and Marys are serving and ‘anointing’. Pray for them.
- How might you make serve others today as if they were Jesus? If you live alone – imagine Jesus as your companion for the day and do things as you would if he were physically present.

REVIEW OF THE DAY

When have you been aware of God during the day?

Which of God's words have carried you through today? Thank God for them.

When you sensed that your work – your care of others – has felt like serving the Lord?

When have you made selfish choices that have crushed or hurt others? Ask God for forgiveness and ideas on how to put things right.

Join in the prayer that will enfold the world tonight...

Ave Regina Caelorum


Hail, Queen of the heavens,
